
About Conductive Education

2017 —

The first class graduated from the Conductor Training Program with 5 graduates. Conductor graduates hired by CECO allowed for growth and serving more students.

2019

An additional five graduated from the Conductor Training Program. CECO collaborated with Down Syndrome Foundation for conductive education programming.

2021

CECO celebrated 20 years! There were 36 students and 12 Adults enrolled. Over the past 20 years, CECO has served hundreds of children and adults and impacted thousands of families with their school day, adult and summer camp programs.

2018

CECO collaborated with Orange County Public Schools on an after school program and also worked with Full Sail University on an interactive technology ladder.

2020

Three new Conductors graduated from the Conductor Training Program.

CECO began virtual education and started the first of its kind Adult Conductive Education Program. CECO also expanded by adding an additional 2,500 sq. feet

2023

CECO has 49 K-12 students, 17 adults, 25 full-time staff, 9 classrooms and 7 innovative programs. CECO also added an additional 3,000 sq feet. for a total of 18,000 sq feet. CECO receives their 1st patent for their Interactive Technology Ladders.

OUR TRANSFORMATIONAL PROGRAMS

All of our programs are uniquely designed to incorporate the basics of conductive education into social, physical, cognitive, and everyday living activities.

SCHOOL DAY PROGRAM

The School Day Program incorporates CE and special education and is designed to address the overall needs of children and young adults with neurological motor disabilities.



YOUNG ADULT PROGRAM



The Young Adult Program is for individuals age 18 -22 with neurological motor disabilities focusing on improving daily living skills and enhancing independence.

ADULT DAY PROGRAM



The Adult Program focuses on the physical, cognitive, and socio-emotional development and improvement of daily living skills that the participant can apply to everyday situations.

INDIVIDUAL SESSIONS

Individual CE sessions addresses the individuals unique needs and is available to any child recommended for the CE program.



VIRTUAL SESSIONS

Virtual sessions involve individual, conductor, and family participating in online conductive education lessons.



YOUNGSTER PROGRAM

The Youngster program is designed to provide both parent and child with the tools and strategies to maximize their child's abilities



SUMMER CAMP

Summer Camp provides an intensive program for individuals with motor disabilities, like cerebral palsy, using CE to improve physical, social-emotional, and cognitive abilities.

- Opened two new classrooms





PARTICIPANT SUCCESS STORIES

Dylan Parnell, 4 years old, joined CECO in 2022 in our Individual Sessions Program and also attended the Youngster Summer Camp in 2023. Upon arrival, Dylan used a posterior walker, faced challenges in following instructions, and struggled with unstable sitting. Today, Dylan walks independently for at least five feet, follows instructions, and exhibits improved balance during extended periods of sitting. Dylan's small steps of growth are helping to make a difference.



Emma Vaccaro, aged 11, joined CECO in 2019 as part of the School Day program. Upon admission, Emma took only four consecutive steps with a gait trainer, faced challenges with sitting and standing, expressed fear of various activities, cried frequently, exhibited social anxiety, and struggled to participate in group activities due to her anxiety. Additionally, she had difficulty communicating her wants and needs effectively. Presently, Emma has made remarkable progress-she can now walk not only with her gait trainer but also with a conductive education ladder with the assistance of one person. She can pull herself into a standing position by holding a CE ladder, and she is capable of maintaining sitting on a bench for almost a minute with close supervision. Beyond these physical achievements, Emma has become an invaluable member of her class, fostering positive relationships with her peers, teachers, and assistants. Her ability to communicate her wants and needs has significantly improved through the use of her PODD book, a picturebased communication system. Emma's transformative journey at CECO exemplifies the impact of our programs based on the holistic development of our students.





Rocky Maiorca and his family moved from Ohio to Orlando in 2021 so that Rocky could attend the Adult Program at CECO. He has shown remarkable progress during his time at CECO. Initially, he transitioned from bench sitting to achieving standing and walking with the assistance of two individuals. To enhance his success, his parents ordered a standing frame for home practice. Not only has Rocky made physical strides, but he has also become more outgoing and social, forming meaningful relationships with his peers. His journey reflects both the personal growth and the supportive community fostered at CECO.

Cooper Smith, 13, became a part of the CECO community in 2017. Initially enrolled in the pilot program at Lake Silver Elementary for a year, he transitioned to the CECO School Day Program for the 2017-2018 year. Cooper relied on a posterior walker and faced challenges in behavior and communication, with limited selfcare skills. Today, Cooper has made significant strides - he walks independently using canes for distances up to 10 feet, has improved behavior, communicates effectively through signs and a touch-based device, and has achieved the milestone of eating independently. His journey at CECO reflects not only personal growth but also the positive impact of our programs on the lives of our students and their families.





Ryan Linder transitioned from the School Day Program to the Adult Program in 2019. He has demonstrated significant progress, notably enhancing his proficiency in using the Neuronode communication device through improved upper body gross motor movements.

Additionally, he has made substantial strides in his social engagement, showcasing a newfound willingness to actively participate in large group activities. This includes lifting CECO superheroes, engaging in outdoor games at school, and participating in adult program activities that involve loud noises or large peer groups. Ryan's achievements reflect not only advancements in his technical skills but also a commendable growth in his social confidence and participation within the broader community.
